Stephanie Alton appeared before the commission with a follow up of her previous requests for public records and to tell the commission of her findings.

INFORMATION

Sheriff Bivens gave a verbal report on the METH problem in Monroe County and the State of Tennessee.

He stated that the State will no longer pay to have meth labs cleaned-up, this would fall on the county. As of 1/1/11 there have been 30 reported meth labs, at a cost of <u>up to</u> \$5,000 each to clean up.

He asked the Commission to prepare a resolution urging legislature to pass a resolution to have this controlled by making certain components used in the manufacture of meth be available by prescription only.
