RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE LOCAL OPTION PROVISIONS OF 1996 PUBLIC CHAPTER 850 REGARDING A PLAN TO AUTHORIZE THE JAIL/WORKHOUSE ADMINISTRATOR TO CHARGE INMATES A COPAY AMOUNT FOR MEDICAL CARE

WHEREAS, Chapter 850 of the Public Acts of 1996, codified in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 41-4-115, is a local option law which authorizes counties to establish and implement a plan to authorize the jail or workhouse administrator of the county to charge inmates a co-pay amount for any medical care, treatment or pharmacy services provided to the inmate by the county; and,

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Legislative Body has determined that it is in the best interests of Monroe County that the county adopt the Act and establish a plan to seek co-pay amounts from inmates in the county jail.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Monroe County Legislative Body meeting in regular session in Madisonville, Tennessee, on the 22nd day of November, 2016, that:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 41-4-115(d), the jail administrator of Monroe County is authorized to seek, from an inmate incarcerated in the county jail a co-pay in the amount as listed on Sheet 1 (attached).

SECTION 2. This resolution shall not be construed as authorizing the county to deny medical care, treatment or pharmacy services to an inmate who cannot pay the co-pay amount established by this plan.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 41-4-115(e), if an inmate cannot pay the co-pay amounts established by Section 1 of this resolution, the jail or workhouse administrator is authorized to deduct the co-pay amount from such inmate's commissary account or any other account or fund established by or for the benefit of such inmate while incarcerated.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 41-4-115(f), the jail or workhouse administrator is authorized to seek reimbursement for the expenses incurred in providing medical care, treatment, hospitalization or pharmacy services to an inmate incarcerated in such jail or workhouse from an insurance company, health care corporation, or other source, if the inmate is covered by an insurance policy, or subscribes to a health care corporation or other source for those expenses.

SECTION 5. This resolution shall be effective upon its passage by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Monroe County Legislative Body and approval, the public welfare requiring it.

RESOLUTION NO. 1122-9

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE USE OF THE COUNTY RIGHT-OF-WAY

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Code allows utilities to be placed within the county right-of-way, and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Code, although varying in particulars concerning specific types of utilities, generally requires that permission be obtained from the county legislative body or the chief administrative officer of the highway department prior to entering upon the county right-of-way to perform work, and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Code also generally requires that work performed within the county right-of-way be performed under the direction and control of the chief administrative officer of the county highway department, and

WHEREAS, it is impractical for permission to be granted in a case-by-case basis by the county legislative body, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to establish clear procedure and rules, to be administered and enforced by the chief administrative officer of the highway department, for the use of the county right-of-way by utilities, so as to minimize interference with vehicular traffic, minimize damage to the county right-of-way, minimize risks to the public safety and convenience, and minimize damage to utilities, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Monroe County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on this 22nd Day of November, 2016, that the following regulations shall apply to the use do county rights-of-way by utilities in Monroe County:

SECTION 1. The following regulations apply to all utilities. "Utilities" includes any line, system or facility, either underground or overhead, used for producing, storing, conveying, transmitting or distributing communications, electricity, gas, petroleum. Petroleum products, hazardous liquids, water, steam or sewerage and other underground or overhead facilities and appliances. The regulations apply to all persons performing work within the county right-of-way. "Persons" includes, but is not limited to, individuals, utility districts, authorities, governmental entities and companies. "Persons" may also be referred to herein as "applicants". The regulations apply to the installation, maintenance and removal of utilities unless otherwise provided.

SECTION 2. Except in cases of an emergency as defined herein, persons must obtain a permit from the county highway department prior to performing any work within the county right-of-way. The permit request shall state the nature and purpose of the work to be performed, the date, location and estimated time of the beginning and end of the work at each site, and the name and contact information of the company or party to be performing the work. The permit request shall be accompanied by the construction plans detailing the work to be performed. Applicants shall also provide copies of any permit(s) required by other governmental agencies. Persons making requests to perform work in the county right-of-way shall use the permit request form designated as Attachment A to this resolution. The permit may include special conditions, as determined in the sole discretion of the chief administrative office of the county highway department, for the protection of the county's property, roads and rights-of-way, as well as the welfare and safety of the general public. Acknowledgement of the receipt of a copy of these regulations shall be a part of the permit request. By issuance of a permit, applicants will be required to conform to these regulations as well as any additional conditions set forth in writing by the chief administrative officer of the county highway department. Once physical work has commenced within the right-of-way, applicants, as recipients of a permit, agree to perform the work in accordance with these regulations and the permit issued hereunder, as well as all other applicable permits, regulations, laws, agency rules, resolutions and ordinances. Monroe County assumes no responsibility for any damage to utilities installed after the effective date of these regulations and that are not installed in accordance with the provisions and conditions of the permit and these regulations. Monroe County assumes no responsibility for any damage to utilities not maintained or removed in accordance with the provisions and conditions of the permit and these regulations.

SECTION 3. Applicants shall submit a permit fee in the amount of ______ along with their permit request. The fee will be used to offset the county administrative and personnel cost related to the enforcement of these regulations.

SECTION 4. All utility installations, maintenance and removals shall be done in accordance with the applicable technical specifications set forth in Attachment B to this resolution and any subsequent specifications adopted by the county legislative body. Persons shall pay the salary and expenses for any inspector(s) that the county highway department may see fit to place upon the work site to ensure compliance with such technical specifications while any such inspector(s) maybe assigned to the work site. The chief administrative officer of the highway department, before incurring any expenses expected to be charged to the applicant, shall advise the applicant in writing of this fact.

SECTION 5. The Department of Commerce and Insurance of the State of Tennessee (the "department") requires that all persons contracting to perform construction work within the state be qualified and licensed by the department if the work is equal to or in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). Requirements for obtaining such a license are determined by the commissioner of the department and may be obtained by contacting the Regulatory Boards Division. All persons and/or the company for which they are employed shall be duly licensed by the department, the state of Tennessee, and any other appropriate governmental agency. Proof of a currently valid Tennessee contractor's license shall be presented when request for a permit is made.

SECTION 6. As a condition of the issuance of a permit, applicants must provide proof of liability insurance with a minimum policy in the amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000).

SECTION 7. If the work that is the subject of the permit request is not of an emergency nature, the chief administrative officer of the county highway department may refuse or delay approval of the permit request if approval would unduly interfere with the work of the county highway department or would cause undue inconvenience to the public. However, the chief administrative officer's approval of the permit request shall not be unreasonably withheld. In the event of an emergency, persons will not be required to comply with the regular permitting requirements set forth herein. For purposes of these regulations, "emergency" means an imminent danger to life, health, or property, whenever there is a substantial likelihood that loss of life, health, or property will result before the procedures in these regulations can be fully complied with. In the event of an emergency, notice of any work within the county right-of-way shall be given to the chief administrative officer of the county highway department in writing in the manner provided by Section 2 or by telephone, within two (2) hours of the beginning of any such activity. If notice is given by telephone, the agent of the person making the call shall enter the date and time of the call, the nature, purpose, and location of the work to be performed, the estimated beginning and ending times of the work, and the name and contact information of the company or party to be performing the work, on a standard permit request form and deliver it to the chief administrative officer of the county highway department by the next business day.

SECTION 8. The chief administrative officer of the county highway department may require an applicant to post collateral to ensure that the county road and right-of-way will be repaired to the same quality as before the excavation or other work was performed. The chief administrative officer will determine the form, amount of the collateral. Should the chief administrative officer of the county highway department execute settlement of the collateral, the proceeds from such execution shall be payable to the Monroe County Highway Fund. In the event of an emergency, as defined herein, the chief administrative officer of the county highway department may require the person to post collateral as provided herein for non-emergency work as a condition for continuing work in the county right-of-way. In the event work is abandoned for a period of thirty (30) consecutive days or a time period specified in the permit, whichever is less, then the chief administrative officer of the county highway department shall be authorized to execute settlement of the collateral in his sole discretion. The proceeds from such execution shall be used to finish the project and to pay all other reasonable costs associated with the project. Any leftover proceeds will be returned to the applicant.

SECTION 9. (a) Persons shall replace or repair any portion of the pavement, shoulders, bridges, culverts, or any other part of the county right-of-way that may be disturbed or damaged as a result of their work performed in the right-of-way. The county right-of-way shall be repaired following installation, maintenance and/or removal of utilities. The right-of-way shall also be repaired if damaged as a result of future line failure or leakage. The chief administrative officer of the county highway department shall be notified prior to any backfilling or bedding of any utility. In the event a person covers, conceals or obscures work in violation of these regulations or in violation of a directive from the chief administrative officer of the county highway department, such work shall be uncovered and displayed for the county's inspection upon request and shall be reworked at no cost in time or money to the county.

- (b) Whenever practical, the chief administrative officer of the county highway department, upon the county highway department receiving a permit request, shall inspect the site before the work begins and shall inspect the site after the work is completed. Inspection by an engineering firm, paid for by the applicant and hired or approved by the county, shall be required, at the discretion of the chief administrative officer of the county highway department, for extensive construction or work within the county right-of-way as a condition to issuance of the permit. In addition, persons shall reimburse the county for all testing, inspections, reasonable attorney and professional fees, and other expenses incurred as a result of any deficient work within ninety (90) days of receipt of an invoice from the county highway department.
- (c) After such inspection(s), if, in the opinion of the chief administrative officer of the county highway department, the condition of the roadway or the right-of-way has been damaged and has not been properly repaired, the chief administrative officer of the county highway department shall determine the nature of the work necessary to return the roadway or right-of-way to a condition substantially equal to its condition before the work was performed, and shall give persons written notice of such deficiency in returning the roadway or right-of-way to its proper condition. As part of such notice, the chief administrative officer shall inform the persons as to whether he/she has elected, in his/her sole discretion, to immediately execute settlement of the collateral and use the proceeds to repair the damage or to allow the persons to repair the damage themselves. If the chief administrative officer elects to allow the persons to repair the damage themselves, such repairs must be completed to the satisfaction of the chief administrative officer within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notice of deficiency. If the damage is not satisfactorily repaired within the thirty-day period, the chief administrative officer shall execute settlement of the collateral and use the proceeds to repair the damage. Regardless of which option is initially chosen by the chief administrative officer, if the collateral is not sufficient to complete the necessary repairs, the chief administrative officer shall facilitate the necessary repairs and persons shall reimburse the county highway department for the cost of such repairs within ninety (90) days of receipt of an invoice from the county highway department.

SECTION 10. Persons performing work within the county right-of-way shall be responsible for road damages, personal injury, property damages or any other damages caused by any negligence on their part, including but not limited to, the improper placing of or failure to display construction signs, danger signs and other required signage and will bear any expense proximately caused by their operation on the right-of-way. This applies whether the applicant or someone acting on the applicant's behalf performs the work. Persons shall provide proper signage, flaggers, barricades, flashing lights or other methods to warn the public of open trenches, obstructions or other impediments to travel. Signage shall conform to the most current edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Persons shall keep all traveled ways clear of obstructions and equipment not directly connected with the project or operation. Any inspection or control exercised by the chief administrative officer of the county highway department shall in no way relieve the applicant from any duty or responsibility to the general public nor shall such services and/or control by the chief administrative officer of the county highway department relieve the applicant from any liability for loss, damage, or injury to persons or adjacent properties.

SECTION 11. For all utilities located above ground, including location signage, persons shall maintain sufficient weed and brush control within a 10-foot radius such that said utilities are easily visible. Monroe County assumes no responsibility for any damage to any utility that is improperly located, signed or maintained for visibility.

SECTION 12. If, at any future time, it should become necessary in the maintenance, construction or reconstruction of a county highway to have applicant's utilities removed in order that said highway may be properly maintained, constructed or reconstructed or in the event said utilities should, at any time, interfere with the use of said highway, the applicant agrees, upon being requested so to do by the highway department, to remove said utilities promptly, at its own expense and without cost to the highway department, unless any requested removal should be contrary to any law of the State.

SECTION 13. Applicant shall be responsible for any conflicts with other utilities or appurtenances that are on the county highway right-of-way and shall notify the respective owner(s) of any conflicts and secure the owner's permission for any alterations.

SECTION 14. By approving the applicant's permit request, the Monroe County Highway Department does not grant the applicant any right, title or claim to any highway right-of-way and in granting this permission to go upon the right-of-way does not, in any way, assume the maintenance of the applicant's utilities.

SECTION 15. Approval of an applicant's permit request shall become void if the work that is the subject of the request is not commenced within thirty (30) days of the date of the permit request.

SECTION 16. The chief administrative officer of the county highway department may employ the county attorney, or other attorney as provided in Tennessee Code Annotated Section 54-7-110, to seek an injunction against any party in violation of these regulations. The chief administrative officer of the county highway department may issue a stop work order if work is being performed in violation of these regulations. Any person violating these regulations shall also be subject to a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500) per violation, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated Section 5-1-121. A "violation" is defined as each day a person is in non-compliance with these regulations.

SECTION 17. A permit may be denied, suspended or revoked by the chief administrative officer of the county highway department when the chief administrative officer has determined that the operation is not being and /or will not be conducted in a manner as prescribed by applicable regulations, rules, resolutions, ordinances or laws. Any violations deemed of a significant nature by the chief administrative officer of the county highway department, or unwarranted damages done to the highway system, may result in a permit being denied, suspended or revoked. The chief administrative officer of the county highway department shall report all such actions to the county legislative body and county attorney. Failure to obtain a permit, abandoning the project, conducting work which is not in accordance with the plans approved by the chief administrative officer of the county highway department or obtaining a permit under the emergency provision when no emergency exists, may also be grounds for denial of future permit requests.

SECTION 18. Pursuant to the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 7-59-310, as a condition of the issuance of a permit allowing for open trenching, the applicant shall provide at least fifteen (15) days' notice prior to the initiation of any work in the county right-of-way to all providers of cable or video services within the county. The notice shall include the particular dates in which the trenches will be available for such cable or video service providers for the installation of conduit, pedestals or vaults, and laterals. This requirement shall be limited to new construction or property development in which utilities will be laid in the county right-of-way.

SECTION 19. In addition to complying with the regulations set forth herein, applicants shall also comply with any and all applicable subdivision and storm water regulations.

SECTION 20. In the event of the occurrence of extraordinary circumstances, the chief administrative officer of the county highway department may modify provisions of these regulations to address the particular situation. The burden of proving such extraordinary circumstances rests with the individual seeking relief. Monetary hardship shall not constitute extraordinary circumstances. Any such approval of a variance from these regulations and any modified conditions or specifications issued by the chief administrative officer shall be in writing.

SECTION 21. These regulations shall be effective from and after November 22, 2016. Acknowledgement of receipt of a copy of these regulations shall be a part of the permit request.

SECTION 22. This resolution shall be effective from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AND MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT 10th JUDICIAL DISTRICT DRUG AND VIOLENT CRIME TASK FORCE

This Agreement is entered into by and among the undersigned parties for and on behalf of their respective governing bodies by virtue of the office the individual holds at the time this Agreement is signed. The governing bodies represented herein are part of the 10th Judicial District of the State of Tennessee.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 12-9-101, et seq., authorizes public agencies to enter into inter-local cooperation agreements; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 6-54-307 authorizes law enforcement agencies to provide one another with mutual assistance; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-7-110, as amended by the Public Acts of 2004, authorizes any law enforcement officer or assistant district attorney general or district attorney general criminal investigator hired by or assigned to a drug and violent crime task force to enforce the laws of the State of Tennessee related to the investigation and prosecution of drug and violent crime cases by conferring the same rights, powers, duties and immunities in every jurisdiction within the judicial district as such officer has within the officer's own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the local governments that are parties to this Agreement wish to avail themselves of all authority conferred by these statutes, and any other provisions of law, to create and operate a drug and violent crime task force for the 10th Judicial District; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the public interest by the parties hereto that such a multi-jurisdictional drug and violent crime task force is created.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. PURPOSE: The purpose of the 10th Judicial District Drug and Violent Crime Task Force (hereinafter "DTF") is to effectively investigate drug crimes within the district by utilizing dedicated, well-trained drug investigators and to consolidate the effort, information, experience and resources of the individual law enforcement agencies within the district to increase effectiveness and to avoid duplication of effort. Further, the DTF will provide assistance, as requested by the parties hereto, on violent crime investigations in the form of manpower and/or technology. This Agreement does not prohibit, or otherwise restrict the law enforcement agencies that are parties to this Agreement from continuing to investigate drug cases or violent crimes within the jurisdiction in which such agency operates.

2. BOARD OF DIRECTORS: The DTF, organized under the 10th Judicial District Attorney's office, shall be governed by the Board of Directors (hereinafter "Board"). The Board shall be comprised of the District Attorney General of the 10th Judicial District and the chief law enforcement officer for each city and/or county within the 10th Judicial District that is a party to this Agreement. The Board shall be comprised of Contributory Members and Non-Contributory Members. A Contributory Member shall be a member that contributes at least two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) yearly to the DTF in the form of personnel, services, or funds. A Contributory Member shall have a vote and be counted for the purpose of determining a quorum at all DTF board meetings. A Non-Contributory member acts only in an advisory capacity and will not vote or be counted for the purpose of determining a quorum at DTF board meetings. The District Attorney General of the 10th Judicial District shall be a Contributory Member. Other local governmental entities within the 10th Judicial District may become a party to this Agreement through written notification to the Board of Directors, and approval by the governing body of the entity and acceptance of this Agreement's terms and conditions. Such added parties may then designate a representative for the Board according to the provisions outlined herein.

Meetings. The Board or the DTF Director will establish the time, date and place for its regular meetings. Regular meetings shall be held a minimum of four times per year. Special meetings of the Board shall be called upon the request of the Chairman or of one-third of the Board members. Notices of all meetings of the Board shall be sent by the Director of the DTF by e-mail or by regular mail at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting. Notice of any particular meeting may be given to some Board members in one manner and to the remaining Board members in a different manner. Notice of such meetings shall be posted for the Public.

<u>Ouorum.</u> Except as otherwise provided herein, a majority of the Board members in person or by proxy shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Except as otherwise provided herein, a majority of the quorum will rule.

Committees The Board may create committees comprised of a number of Contributory Members that would or would not comprise a quorum of the Board to authorize financial transactions, assist in the general operations of the DTF, or whatever other purpose the Board desires. The actions of such Committees between normal Board meetings shall be brought before the full Board for approval at the next regular Board meeting.

<u>Authority.</u> The Board is responsible for the overall policy and direction of the DTF. The duties of the Board include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Selecting a DTF Director. Such person may be assigned from a participating law enforcement agency or governmental entity or hired in addition to assigned personnel.
- 2. Approving assignment or hiring, discharge, or transfer of DTF personnel.
- Overseeing the finances of the DTF to ensure compliance with the procedures required by the State Comptroller, federal grants and any internal financial policies established by the Board.

Officers of the Board. The Board will be chaired by the District Attorney General for the 10th Judicial District or his designated representative, which may be any other Contributory Member of the Board. The Board may elect other officers as the Board deems appropriate.

Voting. Each member of the Board will have an equal vote in the conduct of its business. Voting by proxy or thru an assigned designate will be allowed if the Board member elects this option at any time prior to the date a vote of the Board is taken. A vote by a proxy or assigned designate of a Board member will have the same force and effect as a vote by such Board member in person. Any action authorized in writing by all of the Board shall be an act of the Board with the same force and effect as if the same had been passed by unanimous vote of a duly called meeting of the Board.

Nonliability of Board members. The Board members shall not be personally liable for the debts, liabilities or other obligations of the DTF.

- 3. DRUG TASK FORCE DIRECTOR: The Board shall employ a Director to supervise the day-to-day business of the DTF. The Director shall be responsible for implementing policies approved by the Board and for reporting to the Board at each meeting. The Director's compensation and authority shall be determined by the Board. The Director shall not be entitled to vote at Board meetings. The duties of the Director include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - 1. Select a DTF Office Manager, and/or other necessary office personnel, and receive approval from the Board for such selection(s).
 - 2. Approve expenditure of DTF funds and maintain account of such funds as required by the State Comptroller, federal grant and internal financial procedures established by the Board.
 - 3. Ensure the timely preparation of all reports on DTF activities.
 - 4. Prepare press releases and press information pertaining to the DTF.
 - 5. Prepare policies and procedures for DTF personnel, and receive approval from the Board for the implementation of such policies and procedures.
 - 6. Enter into agreements, leases, and/or contracts on behalf of the DTF. The Director does not have to seek approval from the Board for agreements, leases and/or contracts pertaining to the day-to-day operations of the DTF; however, such agreements, leases and/or contracts must be accounted for within the budget and/or quarterly financial statement provided to the Board. The Board may set a maximum financial obligation which may be implemented through the authority of the Director, to set a standard by which approval must be sought prior to the implementation of agreements, leases and/or contracts pertaining to the DTF.
 - 7. Supervise the day-to-day operations of the DTF.
 - 8. Interview and hire, subject to Board approval, personnel not assigned by other law enforcement agencies.

4. FINANCES: The financial matters of the DTF shall be conducted in accordance with all applicable state and federal laws.

Judicial District Drug Fund. A joint fund shall be established for the monies necessary for DTF operations. Such fund shall be maintained in the office of the Trustee in the county designated by the Board. This fund shall be known as the "Judicial District Drug Fund." All monies including, but not limited to, local government contributions, fines, grant proceeds, seizures and forfeitures for the benefit of the DTF shall be deposited in this fund.

<u>Disbursement of Judicial District Drug Fund.</u> Monies from the Judicial District Drug Fund may be disbursed upon request by the DTF Director. Disbursements shall be subject to the limitations established by the Board in accordance with state and federal law.

Budget. The DTF Director shall prepare an annual budget on or before May 1st of each year designating the manner in which the Judicial District Drug Fund shall be disbursed. Such budget shall be approved by the Board prior to disbursement. Any amendments to the budget shall also be presented to the Board for review and approval.

<u>Purchasing.</u> The Board may adopt policies and procedures concerning purchasing. The purchasing procedure of the DTF must comply with the purchasing procedure of the county wherein the DTF headquarters is located as well as any other applicable state and/or federal law.

Accounting and Reporting. The DTF must maintain the finances and records pertaining to such finances in accordance with state and federal law. The DTF Director shall file a quarterly financial report with the Board.

Audit. An annual audit shall be conducted of the funds maintained by the DTF. The audit will be made by the State Comptroller or a private accountant employed via a majority vote of the Board.

4. **PROPERTY OF THE DTF:** The DTF shall have the authority to maintain control over personal and real property.

Personal Property and Equipment. The personal property and equipment contributed to or purchased by the DTF shall remain the property of the DTF for so long as the DTF is operational. The DTF shall take all necessary measures to protect and maintain any property and equipment in its possession. The property and equipment supplied through employees assigned to the DTF that remain employees of a law enforcement agency and/or governmental entity shall remain the property of the law enforcement agency and/or governmental entity unless otherwise designated in writing.

Real Property. The DTF has the authority to purchase real property and hold such property in the name of the DTF. Any purchase of real property made by the DTF must be made with the authorization of the Director after receipt of approval by a majority of the Board.

Disposal of DTF Property. Obsolete or surplus property of the DTF may be disposed of at the discretion of the DTF Director with approval of the Board. In the event the DTF is dissolved or disbanded, real and personal property in the custody and control of the DTF shall be disposed of by the Board to the law enforcement agencies and/or governmental entities that are parties to this agreement or in accordance with state law as a Court of competent jurisdiction in any county in which the DTF operates within the 10th Judicial District shall direct.

6. PERSONNEL: Any assignment of a law enforcement officer, assistant district attorney general, or district attorney general investigator assigned to the DTF shall have such assignment in writing provided by the chief law enforcement official of the assigning jurisdiction; including, but not limited to, sheriff departments, police departments, task forces, state law enforcement agencies and district attorney general's office, and shall not become effective until approved by the Board. As stated herein, the Director has the authority to hire personnel for the DTF, including agents and/or office staff, after receiving approval for such hire from the Board. Pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-7-110, any law enforcement officer employed by or assigned to the DTF must meet the minimum certification requirements of the peace officers standards and training commission; provided, however, that such officer shall not be entitled to receive a police pay supplement for that certification.

<u>Commission</u>. The director of the DTF shall have the authority to commission personnel assigned to or hired by the DTF with the approval of the District Attorney General for the 10th Judicial District.

Status and Benefits. Any law enforcement officer assigned to the DTF shall remain an employee of the law enforcement agency making the assignment for the purpose of compensation and benefits. Salaries of such officers shall be paid by the respective law enforcement agency making the assignment. A law enforcement officer assigned to the DTF shall retain all rights, privileges and benefits including, but not limited to, insurance, retirement, seniority, promotional consideration and Worker's Compensation with the assigning agency.

Assignment and Transfer. Each law enforcement agency and/or governmental entity that is a party to this Agreement may recommend law enforcement officers for assignment to the DTF. The officer, the assigning agency, the Director or the Board may request assignment changes regarding the officer's position with the DTF. Any assignment or change in assignment pertaining to an officer with respect to the DTF shall be subject to Board approval. Any law enforcement officer assigned by the DTF shall follow the policies and procedures of the assigning agency as well as those established by the Director of the DTF.

7. AUTHORITY OF DTF AGENTS: Any law enforcement officer or assistant district attorney general or district attorney general criminal investigator assigned to or hired by the DTF shall have the same rights, powers, duties and immunities in every jurisdiction within the judicial district as such officer has within the officer's own jurisdiction. Such individuals shall also have the same rights, powers, duties and immunities statewide as such officer has within the 10th Judicial District; provided. that investigations conducted outside the officer's jurisdiction originated within the officer's own jurisdiction and is immediately necessary to an ongoing investigation; or by working in cooperation with another judicial district or multi-judicial district task force or law enforcement agency; or where there exists a mutual aid agreement between the judicial districts or multi-judicial district task forces approved by each district attorney general. See Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-7-110. Any law enforcement officer who is employed directly by the 10th Judicial District Drug Task Force and has been conferred law enforcement powers shall have all the police powers necessary to enforce all State laws, including, but not limited to, all traffic laws, the power to serve and execute warrants, arrest offenders and issue citations.

- 8. IMMUNITIES OF DTF AGENTS: Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, concerning members of judicial district task forces relating to the investigation and prosecution of alleged drug violations, if a claim or suit should be filed against an individual and it is proven that: (1) at the time of the alleged incident the individual was a member of the DTF who was properly certified to the board of claims pursuant to state law; and (2) the alleged liability arose out of the individual's activities as a DTF member; then it shall be conclusively deemed that the individual was not an employee, agent or servant of a local government but was a volunteer to the state. To the extent any conflict exists concerning liability or jurisdiction of the members of the DTF relating to the investigation and prosecution of, but not limited to, drug cases between the provisions established by state law and any mutual aid or interlocal agreement entered into by the DTF, then state law shall take precedence over any such agreement. See Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-7-110.
- 9. CONTRIBUTIONS AND DISTRIBUTION OF INCOME: All contributions by individual agencies that are members of the DTF along with any individualized agreements relating to the distribution of income and/or seized assets between the DTF and individual agencies, will be pursuant to Memorandums of Understanding between the DTF and the respective individual agencies. These agreements will be approved by the District Attorney General, the chief law enforcement officer of the respective agency and the Director of the DTF. All distribution of income and/or seized property will comply with any and all applicable Tennessee state law.
- 10. DURATION AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT: This Agreement shall renew automatically for succeeding terms of one (1) year each, unless the Agreement is terminated pursuant to the provisions contained herein. A party to this Agreement may withdraw at any time by providing written notice to the Board at least thirty (30) days prior to such withdrawal. The DTF may be dissolved upon the vote of a majority of the Board and the approval of the District Attorney General of the 10th Judicial District. Upon such vote, the DTF will wind up its affairs in accordance with the provisions outlined herein. The State of Tennessee shall have the right to approve the disposal of any equipment which it has an interest in (equipment purchased with grant funds).

- 11. CONSTRUCTION: Should any of the provisions or portions of this Agreement be held unenforceable or invalid for any reason, the remaining provisions and portions of the Agreement shall be unaffected by such holding.
- 12. EFFECT: This Agreement shall take effect upon the adoption of the terms of this Agreement by the Board in existence prior to such effective date. Such entities seeking to be parties to this Agreement shall be made such upon receipt by the Board of the minutes of the meeting of the governing body of such party showing agreement to the terms outlined herein. If a participating entity does not seek approval of this Agreement, such entity will be removed from participation on the Board or as an assigning agency of the DTF. The members of the Board and parties to this Agreement will be determined by the signatures affixed hereto by the representative assigned by the governmental agency after approval by the government body of the terms of this Agreement. If a signature and date does not appear by a party's agency, then such agency is not represented on the Board.
