WHEREAS, Monroe County ("the County") is a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the founding document of the United States declares that governments are instituted by the people "deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed"; and

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Board of Commissioners and Monroe County Mayor believe in limited government and that elected and appointed officials should act utilizing conservative principles which ensure freedom and protect civil liberties; and

WHEREAS, the Knox County Board of Health ("KCBOH") has expressed an interest in extending its jurisdiction to and in exercising control over the citizens of Monroe County and businesses located in the County; and

WHEREAS, Monroe County's Health Department provides exceptional service to its citizens and others; and

WHEREAS, Monroe County contends that any effort by KCBOH to exercise control or otherwise regulate the freedoms and liberties of its citizens and businesses is unconstitutional; and

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Board of Commissioners and Monroe County Mayor wish to voice their steadfast opposition to KCBOH's attempt to extend its jurisdiction to and exercise control over Monroe and other counties; and

WHEREAS, this resolution is drafted to voice said opposition.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Monroe County Mayor and the Monroe County Board of Commissioners, in regular session assembled this 23rd day of February, 2021 that the Honorable Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, be informed of their opposition to KCBOH's expressed interest in extending its jurisdiction to and exercising control over Monroe County, and pray that he denies any request by the KCBOH relating to Monroe County. It is further resolved that the Monroe County Mayor is authorized to deliver this resolution to Governor Lee, members of the General Assembly, and other elected or appointed officials in the State of Tennessee.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH AN UPDATED OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM PLAN, DEVISE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR A SAFETY DIRECTOR AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SUCH PROGRAM PLAN

WHEREAS, in compliance with Public Chapter 561 of the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee for the year 1972, Monroe County_hereby updates the Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan for our employees.

WHEREAS, due to various changes in subsequent years, it has become necessary to amend the program plan to comply with more recent state requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Monroe County Board of Commissioners that there be and is hereby amended as follows:

TITLE:

This section shall be known as "The Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan" for the employees of Monroe County.

PURPOSE:

The Monroe County Board of Commissioners in electing to update the established Program Plan will maintain an effective and comprehensive Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan for its employees and shall:

- 1) Provide a safe and healthful place and condition of employment that includes:
 - a) Top Management Commitment and Employee Involvement;
 - b) Continually analyze the worksite to identify all hazards and potential hazards;
 - Develop and maintain methods for preventing or controlling the existing or potential hazards; and
 - d) Train managers, supervisors, and employees to understand and deal with worksite hazards.
 - 2) Acquire, maintain and require the use of safety equipment, personal protective equipment and devices reasonably necessary to protect employees.
 - 3) Record, keep, preserve, and make available to the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, or persons within the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to whom such responsibilities have been delegated, adequate records of all occupational accidents and illnesses and personal injuries for proper evaluation and necessary corrective action as required.

- 4) Consult with the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development with regard to the adequacy of the form and content of records.
- 5) Consult with the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, as appropriate, regarding safety and health problems which are considered to be unusual or peculiar and are such that they cannot be achieved under a standard promulgated by the State.
- 6) Provide reasonable opportunity for the participation of employees in the effectuation of the objectives of this Program Plan, including the opportunity to make anonymous complaints concerning conditions or practices injurious to employee safety and health.
- 7) Provide for education and training of personnel for the fair and efficient administration of occupational safety and health standards, and provide for education and notification of all employees of the existence of this Program Plan.

COVERAGE:

The provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan for the employees of Monroe County shall apply to all employees of each administrative department, commission, board, division, or other agency whether part-time or full-time, seasonal or permanent.

STANDARDS AUTHORIZED:

The Occupational Safety and Health standards adopted by the Monroe County are the same as, but not limited to, the State of Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health Standards promulgated, or which may be promulgated, in accordance with Section 6 of the Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1972 (T.C.A. Title 50, Chapter 3).

VARIANCES FROM STANDARDS AUTHORIZED:

Upon written application to the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development of the State of Tennessee, we may request an order granting a temporary variance from any approved standards. Applications for variances shall be in accordance with Rules of Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development Occupational Safety and Health, VARIANCES FROM OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH STANDARDS, CHAPTER 0800-01-02, as authorized by T.C.A., Title 50. Prior to requesting such temporary variance, we will notify or serve notice to our employees, their designated representatives, or interested parties and present them with an opportunity for a hearing. The posting of notice on the main bulletin board shall be deemed sufficient notice to employees.

ADMINISTRATION:

For the purposes of this resolution, Brandon West_is designated as the Safety Director of Occupational Safety and Health to perform duties and to exercise powers assigned to plan, develop, and administer this Program Plan. The Safety Director shall develop a plan of operation for the Program Plan in accordance with Rules of Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development Occupational Safety and Health, SAFETY AND HEALTH PROVISIONS FOR THE PUBLIC SECTOR, CHAPTER 0800-01-05, as authorized by T.C.A., Title 50.

FUNDING THE PROGRAM PLAN:

Sufficient funds for administering and staffing the Program Plan pursuant to this resolution shall be made available as authorized by Monroe County.

SEVERABILITY:

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any section, sub-section, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this resolution is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

AMENDMENTS, ETC:

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect from and after the date it shall have been passed, properly signed, certified, and has met all other legal requirements, and as otherwise provided by law, the general welfare of the Monroe County requiring it.

WHEREAS, Monroe County desires to explore alternative opportunities to provide animal control services within Monroe County; and

WHEREAS, MCFA desires to pursue an agreement with Monroe County for Monroe County to continue to provide MCFA a sufficient annual monetary contribution to ensure MCFA's ability to provide the needed animal control services; and

WHEREAS, MCFA wishes to negotiate an agreement with Monroe County to address essential terms of such an arrangement; and

WHEREAS, Monroe County is agreeable to authorizing the Monroe County Mayor to pursue such initial negotiations and report back to the Monroe County Commission to secure final approval of any proposed arrangement between Monroe County and MCFA.
